

INTRODUCTION

In past years, the **evidence linking CVA and gender** in humanitarian contexts has grown.

The **evidence is not** necessarily based on **concrete data, but assumptions.**

Evidence focused on **results, not necessarily processes, and is of qualitative or quantitative nature.**

PREPARATION

- Are the organization's teams and partners trained on gender and CVA?
- Has a FSP been identified, and gender awareness issues raised?
- Is there a recent knowledge base on gender and power trends, and markets in context?



MONITORING AND EVALUATION

Involve different genders at all stages of the project

Analyze data disaggregated by sex and age

In feedback systems, are there existing trends for genders?

Review methodologies and processes, equal participation, assess gaps, use gender markers, share findings

AT THE RESPONSE LEVEL

- **Support interested stakeholders** with information on the different needs.
- **Advocate for gender commitments** in coordination groups.
- Promote the **reduction of gaps in access to services.**
- **Sharing experiences, lessons learned.**

EXAMPLE OF GOOD PRACTICE



During the first months of the **COVID-19** pandemic, **CARE** and **UN Women** conducted a RAPID GENDER ANALYSIS that included key data to form an understanding of market access and priority actions to which CVA could contribute.
